

THE STATE OF MISSOURI TO ANY PEACE OFFICER IN THE STATE OF MISSOURI

WHEREAS, on Monday, July 31, 2017 an application in writing, duly verified by the written oath or affirmation of Jennifer Flood, a peace officer, was filed with the undersigned Judge, stating upon information and belief that:

**THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY, ARTICLES, MATERIALS, OR SUBSTANCES TO BE SEARCHED FOR ARE EVIDENCE OF THE COMMISSION OF A CRIMINAL OFFENSE:**

Any and all evidence of assault, armed criminal action or homicide  
This evidence includes:

-trace evidence such as blood, biological samples, gunshot residue, fingerprints, tire or shoe impressions, and fibers;

-firearms, ammunition, spent shell casings or other weapons;

-financial records, correspondence, writings, notes, video tapes, photographs, other documents, phone messages, cell phone messages or e-mails;

-cell phones and phone answering systems or machines;

-computer hardware and all equipment which can collect, analyze, create, display, convert, store, conceal, or transmit electronic, magnetic optical, or similar computer impulses or data, Hardware includes (but is not limited to) any data-processing devices (such as central processing units, memory typewriters, and self-contained "laptop" or "notebook" computers); internal and peripheral storage devices, transistor-like binary devices, and other memory storage devices; peripheral input/output devices (such as keyboards, printers, scanners, plotters, video display monitors, and optical readers); and related communication devices (such as modems, cables and connections, recording equipment, RAM or ROM units, acoustic couplers, automatic dialers,

speed dialers, programmable telephone dialing or signaling devices, and electronic tone-generating devices); as well as any devices, mechanisms, or parts that can be used to restrict access to computer hardware (such as physical keys and locks);

-Computer software and digital information which can be interpreted by a computer and any of its related components to direct the way they work. Software is stored in electronic, magnetic, optical, or other digital form. It commonly includes programs to run operating systems, applications (such as word-processing, graphic, or spreadsheet programs), utilities, compilers, interpreters, and communications programs;

- Surveillance footage and/or digital video recording equipment including but not limited to: hard drives, CD/DVD's and/or video tapes;

-personal property tending to show the identity of persons who are in control of or residing at or a guest at the described location including but not limited to: identification cards, utility bills, receipts, canceled mail envelopes, videotapes, photographs, luggage and clothing.

-correspondence, writings, notes, video tapes, photographs, other documents.

A forensic examination of all seized electronic items may be necessary. The search of a computer system is an exacting scientific procedure which is designed to protect the integrity of the evidence and to recover hidden, erased, compressed, password protected, or encrypted files. Searches and seizures of evidence from computer systems commonly require the seizure of all computer items to be processed by a qualified computer expert in a laboratory or other controlled environment. The high volume of the contents and intentional concealment of criminal activity through random ordering and deceptive file names requires search authorities to examine all the stored data. This process may take months depending on the volume of the data stored, and would be extremely impractical to attempt this kind of search on site.

**AND ARE NOW PRESENT AT THE FOLLOWING PREMISES TO BE SEARCHED:**

The search is to include the residence, all outbuildings, garage, the persons of all individuals present during the execution of the search warrant, and to include all vehicles present, or vehicles under their control, which is on the search sites, or immediately adjacent thereto.

The address commonly referred to as 3686 E. Kingswood Drive., Springfield, Greene County, Missouri. This residence is a single family, multi-level residence, with earth tone stone and brick present on the front exterior of the home. There are four separate garage doors on the residence facing west, and all doors appear closed. The garage doors are tan with a tan trim on them. The numbers 3686 are prominently displayed on the mailbox in front of the residence. The front door of the residence is a wooden door and there is a small decorative window on the door. To access this residence from the intersection of U.S. Highway 60 East and South Highland Springs

Boulevard, one would travel south on Highland Springs Boulevard., continuing until they reached E. Kingswood Drive. One would turn west on Kingswood Drive. 3686 E Kingswood Drive is the 2nd residence west of this intersection, on the south side of the road. The front of the residence faces north.

WHEREAS, the Judge of this Court from the verified allegations of the written application and affidavit(s) filed with it has found that there is probable cause to believe the allegations of the application and affidavit to be true and probable cause exists for the issuance of a search warrant for evidence of a criminal offense.

NOW, THEREFORE, this is to command you that you search the premises described above within ten (10) days after the issuance of this warrant by day or night, and take with you, if need be, the power of your county. If the above described property, articles, materials or substances or any part of it be found upon the premises by you, then you seize, photograph, or copy it and take said property, photograph, or copy into your possession making a complete and accurate inventory of the property seized, photographed, or copied. You shall give to the person from whose possession you seize, photograph, or copy said property a receipt for same together with a copy of this warrant, or if no person be present, you shall leave a copy of said receipt and warrant on the premises in a conspicuous place, and you shall return the property, photograph, or copy taken by you, a duly verified copy of the inventory of it and your return to this warrant, to this Court to be dealt with in accordance with law.

**APPLICATION AND AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT  
FOR EVIDENCE OF A CRIMINAL OFFENSE**

I, Jennifer Flood, a peace officer, solemnly swear, declare and affirm, knowing that false statements made in this document are punishable under law as a violation of §575.060, RSMo, and make the following application for issuance of a Search Warrant, pursuant to the provisions of §542.261, RSMo. et seq., and Article I, § 15 of the Missouri Constitution, supported by this written oath and affirmation and state based upon information and belief that:

**THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY, ARTICLES, MATERIALS, OR SUBSTANCES TO BE SEARCHED FOR:**

Any and all evidence of assault, armed criminal action or homicide  
This evidence includes:

- trace evidence such as blood, biological samples, gunshot residue, fingerprints, tire or shoe impressions, and fibers;
- firearms, ammunition, spent shell casings or other weapons;
- financial records, correspondence, writings, notes, video tapes, photographs, other documents, phone messages, cell phone messages or e-mails;
- cell phones and phone answering systems or machines;
- computer hardware and all equipment which can collect, analyze, create, display, convert, store, conceal, or transmit electronic, magnetic optical, or similar computer impulses or data, Hardware includes (but is not limited to) any data-processing devices (such as central processing units, memory typewriters, and self-contained "laptop" or "notebook" computers); internal and peripheral storage devices, transistor-like binary devices, and other memory storage devices; peripheral input/output devices (such as keyboards, printers, scanners, plotters, video display monitors, and optical readers); and related communication devices (such as modems, cables and connections, recording equipment, RAM or ROM units, acoustic couplers, automatic dialers, speed dialers, programmable telephone dialing or signaling devices, and electronic tone-generating devices); as well as any devices, mechanisms, or parts that can be used to restrict access to computer hardware (such as physical keys and locks);

-Computer software and digital information which can be interpreted by a computer and any of its related components to direct the way they work. Software is stored in electronic, magnetic, optical, or other digital form. It commonly includes programs to run operating systems, applications (such as word-processing, graphic, or spreadsheet programs), utilities, compilers, interpreters, and communications programs;

- Surveillance footage and/or digital video recording equipment including but not limited to: hard drives, CD/DVD's and/or video tapes;

-personal property tending to show the identity of persons who are in control of or residing at or a guest at the described location including but not limited to: identification cards, utility bills, receipts, canceled mail envelopes, videotapes, photographs, luggage and clothing.

-correspondence, writings, notes, video tapes, photographs, other documents.

A forensic examination of all seized electronic items may be necessary. The search of a computer system is an exacting scientific procedure which is designed to protect the integrity of the evidence and to recover hidden, erased, compressed, password protected, or encrypted files. This residence is a single family, multi-level residence, with earth tone stone and brick present on the front exterior of the home. The numbers 3686 are prominently displayed on the mailbox in front of the residence. The front door of the residence is a wooden door and there is a small decorative window on the door. Kingswood Drive. One would turn west on Kingswood Drive. 3686 E Kingswood



Drive is the 2nd residence west of this intersection, on the south side of the road. The front of the residence faces north.

**GROUNDS FOR ISSUANCE:**

The above described property, articles, materials or substances is/are located in Greene County, Missouri, at the place described above and constitutes evidence of the commission of the criminal offense(s) of 1st Degree Assault, Armed Criminal Action, or Homicide . Pursuant to Missouri Revised Statutes § 542.271, a Judge of the Circuit Court of Greene County, Missouri has jurisdiction to issue a search warrant for such evidence. Upon information and belief, the facts establishing the grounds for this application and the probable cause for believing that such facts exist are detailed below.

**PROBABLE CAUSE:**

I, Jennifer Flood, have been a law enforcement officer with the Greene County Sheriff's Office for over 12 years. I have attended schools and seminars related to the field of crime scene investigation and the investigation of the crime(s) of 1st Degree Assault, Armed Criminal Action, or Homicide. I have conducted several investigations and assisted in the issuance and execution of search warrants related to those crimes and I have arrested suspects as a result of those investigations. Upon information and belief based upon the following, I believe the above described items will be found at the above described location to be searched.

On July 30, 2017, Greene County Patrol Deputies were dispatched to 3686 E. Kingswood Drive, Springfield, Missouri, in reference to a male holding a female hostage. When Deputies arrived at the above address, there was no response from the home. Deputies noticed what appeared to be a deceased body inside the residence. Deputies forced entry into the residence and located a second deceased body inside the residence, as well as multiple guns around the bodies.

Upon further review, it was determined the 911 call came from a neighbor who stated a female ran to their home telling them that a male had another female hostage at this residence. The female, identified as Billie Cummings (DOB: 12/2/1988), told Deputies she was inside the home and overheard a male and female arguing. She then heard three gunshots. She was able to escape the residence by exiting out a bathroom window. While she was trying to climb down from the roof, she heard one more gunshot, at which point she ran to a nearby house for help. According to Cummings, she identified the other two persons in the residence as Tiffany Fleming and Robert O'Block. Cummings stated Fleming and O'Block were in a relationship. She also stated throughout the evening, she heard O'Block and Fleming arguing and screaming at one another. Cummings described O'Block and Fleming's relationship as hostile and abusive in the past. Cummings stated she was a friend of Flemings and had been staying at the home for the past few days.

Greene County Sheriff Detectives spoke with J.J. Goulbourne. J.J. Goulbourne previously worked for Greene County and has been a commissioned law enforcement officer. Goulbourne stated he works for Dr. O'Block, one of the suspected deceased persons. Goulbourne stated that Dr. O'Block had asked him to set up surveillance systems. Goulbourne stated he did not set up the surveillance system, but he was unsure if Dr. O'Block had someone else do the work instead. Also, Detective Sgt. Crawford observed a "game camera" type recording device located on the east side of the residence.

Based upon my information, Dr. O'Block founded a company called Center for National Threat Assessment. Dr. O'Block is involved in forensics including the use of computers and technology. I believe the computer equipment in the home will provide evidence regarding the relationship between the deceased individuals, any other person involved, and provide some explanation for what occurred.

Based upon my experience, I believe there will be cell phones belonging to the deceased individuals inside of the home. I know that individuals generally keep their cell phone on or near their person. I know that individuals use cell phones to make phone calls, communicate via text or messaging, and search the internet. I believe that analysis of these phones will provide evidence regarding the actions of these individuals in the time leading up to the shooting.

Based upon my training and experience, I know that individuals maintain documentation in their home which can establish the relationships among the people living at the location. This documentation can be in the form of letters, bills, banking records, etc. This documentation is important to establish the nature of the relationship between the deceased individuals, the witness, and any other individual. I know that documentation of this type can be found in both hard copy form and electronic formats. It is essential that the search include both hard copy format and electronic format to ensure that all relevant evidence is collected.

In a homicide investigation, it is necessary to corroborate statements of witnesses. A search of computer, cellphones, or other devices, is needed to analyze the contact between a victim and possible suspect(s). This contact can occur via photographs, videos, and audio files, contact history, e-mail messages and attachments, deleted or lost data, call history, voice mails, instant messages, SMS text messages and MMS multimedia messages, and stored geo-coordinates.

WHEREFORE, your Affiant hereby makes application for a Search Warrant authorizing the Affiant, and/or other representatives of the Greene County Sheriff's Office, with proper and necessary assistance, to search the above described premises and to seize any and all of the

aforesaid property, articles, materials and substances found by virtue of such Search Warrant and to list the items seized on a return and inventory, to be filed within this Judicial Circuit within ten days of this date.
